

Greetings unto the Mountain and its Populace!


I hope you have all had a busy and fun month of many events, learned much and plan to do something with what you have learned.

As this is the month of St. Patrick's, I asked our (then) Seneschal (and representative of the clergy) to share a bit of history for us about the real St. Patrick. This is what Master Geoffrey "Bish" D'Ayr had to say about the now famous saint.

St. Patrick - Patron Saint of Ireland

Patrick, or Patricius, was born in Roman Britain in the early 5th Century, son of a Decurion, somewhere in Cumbria in what is now England. At the age of 14 he was captured by raiding Irish pirates and brought to Ireland and enslaved, working as a shepherd or swineherd for his master for about 6 years. During this period, turning to his earlier education he became a devout convert to Christianity. After 6 years of captivity he heeded a voice he heard saying that it was time for him to return home, and that his ship was ready. He fled to a port 200 miles away and was able to talk his way onto a ship for England.

Later he studied at Auxerre and Tours in France, and was ordained into the priesthood. He returned to Ireland, still following his visions and voices, and converted many thousands from paganism and the beliefs of the Druids — which earned him no friends among the Chiefs and Druids. He was a foreigner, and refused to accept gifts of land or money or goods for his services of baptism, which by the customs of the times put him outside the circles of kinship and mutual obligation and reinforced his foreignness. He is viewed as the first Archbishop of Ireland, although there are several church records which dispute his authority and attribute ultimate authority for the conversion of the Irish to Wilfred, Archbishop of York.

Many legends accrued to the person of St Patrick, including his use of the shamrock to explain the Trinity. The banishing of all snakes from Ireland is another legend, but since there is no fossil record of there ever having been snakes in Ireland at any time after the retreat of the last glaciation, the story is now thought to be a parable of St Patrick driving the Druid s and their beliefs off the island through his conversions.

St Patrick died sometime in the mid 460's, allegedly on March 17th, which became his feast day at the time of his canonization, shortly after his death.

Nowhere in the legends are there any references to green beer or dressing like a leprechaun (he would have been horrified), and please don't assume that every Ginger you see is Irish – they are more likely Scottish (or Danish or Polish).

A Calligraphy Primer

I am Lady Qulan, a novice Calligrapher. I say this now so that others do not confuse me as a first rate authority on this subject. However, I have had the opportunity to learn from several gifted scribes and I wanted to share one of the first lessons I learned about sizing and writing letters.

No matter what script you wish to use, the size of your pen nib will in dictate the width and size in which the letters can be formed, at least from what I have experienced and seen. Now before I go into all kinds of details allow me to help give a little information that many scribes take for granted in a person just beginning this art. Learning about your pen, inks and paper is just as important as learning how to write with them so I'm going to take a few minutes to describe your pen so you know which parts to which I am referring in my primer. I have included a few pictures to help with this.

To start with there are several different types of calligraphy pens. These range from a simple piece of wood that has been shaped and hardened to some of the more sophisticated self-loading pens and pre-inked markers. All of them have similar characteristics depending on what style of calligraphy one wants to create. The deciding factor is the <u>nib</u> of the pen. The nib is the tip of the pen that touches the paper and expresses the ink as you write. The diagram below is one such nib and labels the more common parts in the nib that I will be using.



For the sake of simplicity I am going to use a generic pen that is typical of period style pens and quills. It is a pen that has to be dipped into the ink so no short cuts here. Also the size of the nib at the tines is a C-3 which is an average size nib comparable to the ones you will see on most of the ink pens for beginners. The first picture is showing you the nib properly set with the shank secure in the handle of the pen. The second picture below is showing you the grip area and general style of pen I am using.






As stated this is a dip pen, meaning one must dip it into ink in order to write with it. When using this style of pen, you only want to dip the pen up to the shoulder area of the nib to load the ink. If you dip it past this area, it will have excess ink near the shaft that can drip onto your page.

Next let's address paper. Paper is one of my favorite subjects as there are so many kinds of paper available that can have a huge impact on the outcome of your work. Some paper can be thick or textured like washi or hand-made paper. Others are designed to soak up water/ink such as the kind of paper used when working with water colors and certain styles of paints. Parchment and Pergamenata are other forms of media to use as well and the latter is often used in scrollwork. Regardless of which medium you use, know your surface on which you plan to write. Take time to see how your ink reacts to your medium. Draw a few practice lines on a spare piece that will allow you to see how the ink you are using soaks into the page or sits on top of it.


Last of all is our subject of ink. Again, much like paper and pen there are various forms of ink out there. Some you mix yourself such as the oriental ink sticks. Other commercial inks have gel in some of them which allow them to flow well but take much time to dry so they can easily smear. Period pigments can also be used as inks as well as the illumination for your work. Try out your inks before you buy if you can, or see if you can ask a scribe you know for suggestion on what they may use as a starter. As a last note on all of these supplies, price is not always a clear indication of quality. I have purchased some of the most expensive inks to find I hated the way they would smear or rest on my pen. One of the most standard black gal inks is made by Hibbs and is about average in quality and price, but like I said ask for suggestions. There are many scribes in our Kingdom and beyond who know a thing or two about inks. Also refer to the Scribes Handbook (http://scribe.atlantia.sca.org/resources/WorkingHandbook.pdf) online for some ideas as well. There is a wealth of ideas on the web and on

Now, onto our practice: Once you have settled on your supplies, it's time to get in some practice. Choose a style of calligraphy to which you will want to practice and play with. There are many styles listed in the Scribal Handbook as well as resources on the web and in the library if desired. In either case you will want something that shows the strokes for creating your lettering.


This is the book I am using as it provides several styles of Calligraphy and how to make the letters.




The format in the margins of this book provides information on the style of calligraphy and the size of the nib to use.



We start by creating a practice lettering stanza. This may be different with each of the different styles of writing so it is helpful to use when forming the letters. Take a blank piece of paper and orient it such that it is in a landscape position. Then dip your pen in the ink and blot it to get the excess off of the nib. Then make five marks one on top of the other diagonally on the top left of the page leaving a 1 inch margin for the page.




Then draw a line from the top and middle marks lengthwise across the page to create a lettering stanza.



Then refer to the lettering guide of the book to help you get the stroke pattern and number of strokes for the letter you are attempting to create. Your goal is to keep the letter centered using the middle line for reference. Here are a few of the letters I chose to write and how they appear with the strokes on the page.





This is a rough example but I hope you get the idea. Each of the numbered lines for the letters represent the order in which the stroke of the pen should be and in what direction. It takes a little practice and some letterings come more naturally than others but with a little effort and time calligraphy can be an enjoyable and rewarding art.

I hope my pictures and directions are clear enough to encourage any of you to try your hand at this wonderful art. Even if you never do it for a scroll or open display, knowing this art is a wonderful way to do something nice for yourself. Writing is its own reward of expression much like painting and drawing, and essentially using a calligraphy pen has similarities to these other arts. 



