Unto the populace of Atlantia, greetings from the Kingdom Seneschal.

Over the past couple of days, there have been some messages online talking about people acting badly, violating the SCA code of conduct, and even insinuations of real world crimes such as assault. I want to take a moment to remind everyone of the procedures for grievances.

First and foremost, if someone commits a violation of real world law, the proper legal authorities should be contacted at once. If this action occurred at an SCA event, please also notify your branch seneschal and me of the occurrence.

If you believe yourself to be the victim of harassment, bullying, discrimination, or anything else, please make a formal complaint through your local branch seneschal, or directly to me. We can not do anything without a written complaint giving details of the situation, dates, times, locations, and witnesses. Simply saying "Lord So-and-so harasses women" will not suffice. We can't go on a fishing expedition looking for bad behavior. I have several investigators whom I work with to determine if a complaint is valid, and if so, what steps should be taken. We must be able to investigate specific incidents, not broad generalities.

Not all incidents will be actionable. Posts made on a person's private social media page are generally out of the jurisdiction of the SCA, except in some circumstances. Complaints with no evidence to support the allegation cannot be acted upon. But all complaints are kept on file, and multiple continuing complaints may indicate a pattern.

If you come to me with a report of bad behavior on the part of someone, I will listen to you and I will take the complaint seriously, no matter who it is against. Rank, office, titles do not matter to me. If it is against someone that I don't feel I can be objective about, for or against, I have people I will hand it off to who can be objective and impartial.

Following an investigation into the complaint, if it is determined to be actionable, I will consult with Their Majesties to jointly determine the next step. There are a variety of steps that may be taken from a reprimand on up to a complete R&D from the Society. Please keep in mind there are rules and procedures that must be followed, and if they are not followed, the BoD may reject the resolution or send it back to be re-done.

If you have any questions about the grievance procedure, or sanctions in general, please don't hesitate to contact me. I won't be able to comment on specifics of any particular complaint investigation, or the results of one, but I may be able to answer general questions about them. Please keep in mind that the privacy of all individuals involved must be respected.

Incidents cannot be investigated unless my office receives a complaint. All complaints are kept confidential, with only those needing to know being informed. Subjects of complaints are not informed of the identity of the complainant.

I take complaints of bullying, harassment, and bad behavior very seriously. But I can not do anything about the issues unless they are reported to me.

Remember, be kind to each other. Respect everyone. It costs nothing to be a good person.



BWATT III



After Action Reviews are conducted by professional organization to seek improvement in performance. n the military AARs are a professional discussion of a training event that enables members/units to discover for themselves what happened and develop a strategy for improving performance. There are several questions that must be addressed: A true After Action Review contains the first element of what was supposed to happen.... Followed by what actually happened. We look at the two and determine if we met our mark and achieved what we set out to do.

- -If we failed where did we go wrong?
- -If we succeeded where did we go right?
- -Did our objectives change?
- -Did we adjust?
- -What were the factors?
- -What must be done differently?

By knowing the steps we took to make this happen, we will be able to understand and affect change or keep it rooted in BAWT IV. "BAWT event is designed to develop the Kingdom of Atlantia's Army. This is accomplished by inculcating Combat Archers as a vital entity to our tactics.

This year a modern facility has been procured to enhance training and allow for more participants focusing more on training and less on support requirements."

The over-arching plan was to develop scenarios that incorporated Combat Archers and Armored fighters in force on force melees that included Open Field Battles, Bridge Battle and Keep Battles. Further, we realized that geography would come into play and had to knowing move forward with an understanding that BAWT is only part of a strategy to train Atlantia's Army. 80% of attendance would be southern fighters.. and 20% would come from the northern regions... IF any fighter attended from the north we would go out of our way to make sure they had lodging and were fed. They would have to endure windshield time or coordinate to have their armor transported down to BAWT. The follow up training now is Kings Assessment. Hopefully Armored fighters from the South will make their way north and make a difference.

BWATT III-continued

Training Objectives:

PLANNED AND COMPLETED Authorizations: Armored and Combat Archery
PLANNED AND COMPLETED Battle Formations/Battle Commands
PLANNED AND COMPLETED Force on Force activities- Fight thru and Conquer Scenario
PLANNED AND COMPLETED CoGs Alley -Combined Arms Drill
PLANNED NOT COMPLETED Diverse - Matched Weapons Tourney
PLANNED NOT COMPLETED Five Weapons Challenge to test your stamina.

During the year-long planning process we kept the members informed using a private Facebook page where we could moderate and post updates and keep members excited. This has limitations and it affected the rapier folks who generally have not become members of the armored community and as a result were not on the FB page.

I'll address the functional areas of Facility/Training/Lodging/Sustainment

FACILITY: The facility cost us \$950.00. Breakdown is \$600.00 for Grounds, \$200.00 for the Gym, \$150.00 for the cafeteria. The FFA only charged us one day for the Gym (\$100.00) and they waived the cafeteria fee as we consumed 40 breakfast meals Friday and 40 breakfast meals Saturday. Although the meal was \$13.00... it allowed us to have a facility free. I know that we had 148 persons on site... \$15.00 x 148 equates to \$2,220 we were definately in the black this time.

TRAINING: Using the template we had for the first two BAWTs was successful. This BAWT however we weren't as spent trying to train in 90 degree heat with no chance to escape from the heat. One additional feature this site has is the possible use of a fenced in paintball facility that had rubber obstacles inside of it. Ideas of imitating a Allied Champions force on force capture the flag battle and a few limited time resurrection battles was briefly discussed. Issues brought up from the AAR request yielded more time for Combat Archery training and being part of more scenarios.

- A better system to post the schedule that can be used to inform (larger print).
- Authorizations: anyone who is interested in an authorization in a
 weapons form or new discipline.. they need to make it clear to the respective disciplines marshal. Once known coordination MUST occur
 with the MoLs who support the event.
- Field Sign in/ Troll Sign in/Armor inspections... We can not take corners
 in safety measures. These cover us for insurance purposes. We got
 caught short again... suffice to say we were able to correct the issue
 before it got out of hand but procedures weren't followed.



BWATT III

LODGING:

A working agreement with the FFA resulted in a cost of \$60.00 for a three night stay. Although the accommodations were bunk beds,,, they were all in good repair with HVAC working and modern showers. This was a dorm type setting. The cost of the event although on the surface pricy.. the value was there. Further the FFA allowed us to assign an "Agent" to run check in and assign beds. They relied on us to be fair, and honest... We were, however, "check out procedures" needed to be addressed and clear. Many folks swept and cleaned up their areas however many had filed to mop after they departed. The mops were outside the dorms and many needed new mop heads. We agreed we could pay more attention to this area next time by assigning an "RA" or resident advisor so we could enforce cleanliness and departure conditions. Prior to "kick off" we merely stated we would work to get folks into the same dorms as much as possible. However comments yielded that more certainty to the arrangements needed to be made and transparent. I think we can get to that point. We just needed to get folks into the lodging to see how exceptional the site and conditions were.

- Tent camping was available and four campers used this option. Cost was \$30.00 per tent space. So that meant we could get families to "camp" and it would now be cost effective....
- RESTROOM facilities were available and were quite a distance from the field.. further they weren't marked so it was a mystery on how to find and use them... The solution in the future for adjusting this is to use the barracks closest to the melee fields for campers as well as guest alike and MARK IT.

SUSTAINMENT:

- Food/Water. Realizing the site was off the beaten path and we wanted folks to stay on site to train we did what we could to provide food and water for as little as possible. Water was provided field side in two coolers. 6 cases of water were used per day. Ice was available on site free of charge.
- Breakfast was offered by the FFA for \$13.00.
- Lunches were picked up from Publix and IGA for a cost of \$200.00 a pop. This was offered for a donation. I came up with \$8.60 in the black after reconciling the account on Saturday. The lunches were late on Saturday and the location could have been better to present them to the fighters. Possible even adjust the fighting schedule longer and eat AFTER fighting...
- Dinner. Sean Dwyer and Paul Padget were called in to create two low cost nutritious dinners. They had a budget of \$600.00. Headcount for Friday was expected to be 30 and Saturday it was expected to be 50. The meals were meant to be buffet style with servers to ensure correct portions.
 - * Friday Roasted chicken, sweetened carrots, breads and watermelon were served. Everyone had a half chicken there were 50 pieces... I saw only two left at the end of the night.
 - * Saturday Roasted pork shoulder, grilled seasoned sweet potatoes, Cole slaw and sweetened ricotta cheese in a wine reduction. We had quite a few pork shoulders not eaten. Spaghetti Oleo was served as an alternate dish for both days for folks who had allergies.

Folks who ate were asked for a simple donation. The donations collected were divided between Paul and Sean. Both cooks were happy. The seed money was replaced. There are probably a few more points to this AAR but presented is a LOT of information


MISSING PIECES:

- Classrooms. The facility had the space for classes and displays. We attempted (as an after thought) to fil the void with viable classes directly related to Armored Combat. Classes on MoLs, Fighting garb and Marshal updates were planned. This area needs a deliberate "planned" approach.
- Vendors. We did not incorporate any vendors nor plan for them. This area can be developed.

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Moorhaven Meeting Report Report by Katherine of the Doves


